#### 5. Data and Reports

FYSPRT required to look at data to make recommendations. Does not have to be specific to Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe), but MUST include WISe.

Informational

- WISe Data (Information presented by Irene)
  - Providers currently use Child/Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) Survey to determine if a youth qualifies for WISe. The screen is inputted into the Behavioral Health Assessment System (BHAS) portal.
  - Once family enters WISe, a full CANS assessment is done at 30 days, then every 90 days, and then at discharge
  - Each assessment is entered into BHAS data portal, which keeps track of all data
  - The following data reports were shared:
    - Key Intervention Needs over Time (Skagit and Whatcom Counties, does not include Compass Health due to data entry problem) January 1, 2015 – July 31, 2015
      - Main takeaways: need for intervention goes down over time, meaning functioning is increasing; change over 6 months seems to be expected, as this is the amount of time it takes WISe teams to develop rapport and stabilize situation
    - Strengths Development Over Time (Skagit and Whatcom Counties, does not include Compass Health due to data entry problem) 7/1/2014 – 6/30-2015
      - Main takeaway: trend is for an increase in strengths over time
    - Screening Timeliness (Skagit and Whatcom Counties)
       July 1, 2015 September 30, 2015
      - Screens within 10 days of referral: 54.55%
      - Screens not within 10 days of referral: 45.45%
      - In our overall Medicaid contract, it is stated that we must offer an appointment in the 10 day time period. However, this report does not capture specifics why screen occurred outside 10 days of referral.
- Target Goals: Utilization (Action Item: Add to packets)
  - State would like to see North Sound have capacity to serve
     460 kids at any given time with WISe. We are approximately
     20% towards target currently.

- This does not match with our historical data regarding need.
   It is believed region wide need would be closer to 300.
- 460 kids is approximately 10% of all kids who ever receive a service in our system (currently we have 4,600 kids in a given year who have more than a crisis contact with our system)
- We need to try and work towards above goal, but we cannot over enroll individuals.

#### • Data Review Protocol Appendix D

- Intention of the state: each report has questions that are supposed to be answered by the group collectively; however, the questions seem to be difficult to understand
- Discussion/Feedback ensued regarding the wording of the questions: PhD language, ridiculous, not family and youth friendly, no benchmarks or baselines, too vague, too openended, catering to very scientific minded group of people
- Julie asked if there was any objection to her giving feedback to the state that this format is not helpful; no objection noted
- Action Item: Email questions to group
- Action Item: Julie write letter by December 31, 2015. Include parents and youth in writing letter

#### Gaps Analysis Results (2014)

- Tied to Department of Behavioral Health and Recovery (DBHR); hired University of Washington (UW) to do a gaps analysis to look at research and evidence based programs, and what is available for children's mental health in region
- Looks at fiscal year 2013; Provider One is the data system that collects all services and payments
- Data came from individuals at agencies who would have the most knowledge about interventions for staff development and training
- Most prevalent diagnosis was depression, followed by anxiety
- No hotspots identified in North Sound (a hotspot is defined as at least 40 youth in a year not having access to a year within a geographical area)
- 47 therapists were recently trained in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, (CBT)+, this increase should extend capacity to serve additional 338 youth/year (if no duplicates in trained therapists from the original survey and no staff turnover)
- The addition of the above trained therapists should help eliminate gaps is services
- Discussion ensued about pros and cons of including data: subjective, not stand alone, informative as one piece of data
